Mark 1:15

ΜΕΤΑΝΟΕΙΤΕ ΚΑΙ ΠΙΣΤΕΥΕΤΕ – repent & believe – present tense, active voice, imperative mood verbs – Commands that say keep repenting & believing.

Compare 1 John 1:9 – Here "confess" (ὁμολογῶμεν) is a present tense, active voice verb (subjunctive mood – here a 3rd class conditional sentence). Hence, if we keep on confessing our sins.....

Nowhere does the Bible teach one is to ask Jesus into their heart to be saved!!
Does it bother anyone that this formula or language is not found in the New Testament?

What about John 1:12, 13?

"But to all who did receive him, who believed in his name, he gave the right to become children of God, who were born, not of blood nor of the will of the flesh nor of the will of man, but of God." Here "believe" is present tense.

A person is saved by faith alone - believing what God has said about Himself, about the atoning work of Christ, about the person of Christ.

Therefore if any man is in Christ, [he is] a new (Gk. – kainos – of new quality and kind) creature; the old things passed away; behold, new (kainos) things have come. 2 Cor. 5:17
